

"Mysteries at Lunch" Book Group July - December 2025



Puzzle Me a Murder (Alice Pepper Lonely Hearts and Puzzle Club) by Roz Noonan (Series Mystery – Summer Reading)


Wednesday, August 20 – Discussion Held at East Street Park
