# **Library Service Update**



Do you miss browsing for books in the library? We miss you, too! Library staff are in the process of making changes in anticipation of opening for some select public services. We are moving shelving and materials, establishing an appointment system, performing staff health checks, and more. We can't wait to show you what we've been working on!

Starting this fall, we will reopen the lower level of the library for limited services, with some significant changes. New materials for all ages and in all categories will be available on the lower level to browse. The copier and two computers will also be available for public use. Library staff will be on hand at the downstairs desk to renew library cards, check out materials, and answer questions.

Why open just the lower level? We are following safety guidelines from the state and the CDC, which limit the number of people in the building at one time. With entrances on both levels, it is difficult to monitor appointments and be sure we are within safety parameters. We also have several staff members continuing to work from home due to health issues, so we will be working with a smaller staff to help with in-person services. Using only one service desk helps us staff the library more efficiently.

Curbside pickup is now available, and will continue once we open for limited hours of in-person service. We are now offering Contactless Homebound Delivery as well.

We will post more information about this new level of service on our website in September. Follow us on Facebook.com/WinfieldLib to be sure you see updates as they happen. We appreciate your patience and understanding that we must place the safety of our staff and patrons first.

Not sure what to read next? The library's new Grab Bag service is here to help! Email us your name, age (if not for an adult), and what type of books you want to read and we'll place some items on hold for you for curbside pickup. ### **Contactless Homebound Delivery**

Homebound delivery service has now resumed as a contactless service. Any library patron is who is permanently or temporarily homebound is eligible for this service. Curbside pickup is still available, but if you are homebound because of the Covid-19 epidemic you may choose contactless delivery.

To request delivery, email us at wfdstaff@winfield.lib.il.us with a list of what books you'd like. Ask for specific titles or books in your favorite genre. You will be notified by the Homebound Delivery team to schedule your delivery time. Books will be delivered to a porch, step, garage, or other contactless delivery point.
