We're excited to debut our online summer reading program, "Reading Colors Your World!" The program will run from June 1 through July 31 on our new platform, READsquared.

You may register using the link on our website at www.winfield.lib.il.us or you may download the READsquared app from your device's app store.

Register, log your reading online, and redeem points for virtual raffle tickets to win gift cards. Parents can add readers to their accounts to log their children's reading activity.

Although we are using READsquared this summer, the rest of our program will feel very familiar if you have participated in Summer Reading in the past. We have reading programs and special events for pre-k, kids, teens, and adults.

Read whatever format you like! Print books, audiobooks, and eBooks all count. For adults, each group of three books you read earns you a raffle ticket. For all other ages, every 60 minutes read earns a raffle ticket. These requirements echo our reading programs in past years. Don't worry! Digital badges will help you track your progress.

Since we are generally keeping our events virtual through the summer, we are offering an additional incentive to participate in online events! Every event for every age group will have a secret code word you can use to earn more points toward raffle tickets. Just log in to READsquared after the event and click the "Enter Code" button. There, you'll enter the secret code for the event you attended.

The last day to log activity is Saturday, July 31. Prize drawings will be held the week of August 2. Winners will be notified by e-mail or phone and prizes mailed to the address provided.

- Find the All Headings button near the search bar at the top of the page. Click the Select Resources icon, also known as the "burger" or the "stack of pancakes," next to the All Headings button.
- Click the text link to "New York Times Digital." A new window will pop up with a code. Click "Redeem."
- Next, create a New York Times account.
- You will see that your access will last 24 hours. You can log in again after 24 hours using this same procedure.
