Tuesday, January 7

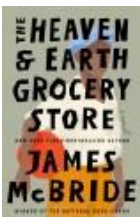

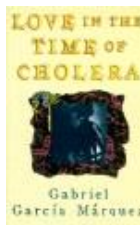

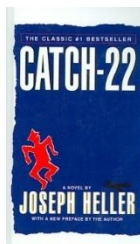
