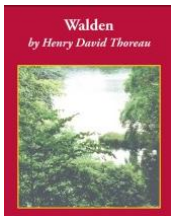


Our book group meets at 7:00 p.m. the first Tuesday of the month. Copies of discussion books will be available at the Adult Services Desk one month before the group meets.

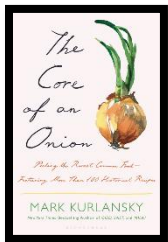


***Walden* by Henry David Thoreau (Classic Fiction – Summer Reading Selection)**

Walden is a treatise on the subjects of self-sufficiency, individualism, relationship with nature, and rejection of material ambition.

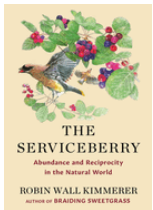


***The Core of an Onion* by Mark Kurlansky (Nonfiction – Summer Reading Selection)**

Tuesday, September 1 (Discussion Held at the Barber Shoppe)

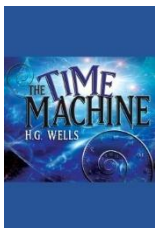

Tuesday, October 6

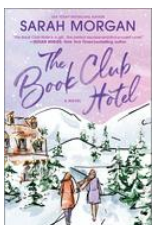
