PressReader has unlimited access to more than 2,000 newspapers and 3,000 magazines in 60 languages. PressReader includes the Chicago Tribune, Chicago Sun-Times, USA Today, Los Angeles Times, and more. You may also use the PressReader app! When you sign in, be sure to choose "Library or Group" our PIN is the same password you use for the library catalog. You will need to log in again after 30 days.

We added PressReader and The New York Times last year, as we searched for ways to expand our resources that are accessible from anywhere with your library card. The response from our community has been so positive that we will be keeping these subscriptions. We hope you take advantage of these and all our digital resources.

Find More Illinois



One of our most popular services is interlibrary loan, which allows the library to borrow materials and have them shipped to Winfield for our members. Find More Illinois is an expansion of interlibrary loan that allows Winfield library cardholders to directly request materials from other libraries.

First, login and check the Winfield Library catalog. If you don't find the item you are looking for, you may now use Find More to give you more libraries to search. Click on the stack next to the search box.

This will open a drop-down menu that will allow you to turn on the ILL (interlibrary loan) option. Check the ILL box, repeat your search, and you'll see which of our partner libraries own the item. If the item shows as available, place a hold on that item just like you do in our regular catalog. Still can't find it? Place your interlibrary loan request via phone or email, and a librarian will locate your item.


