Library Referendum Tuesday, March 21, 2006

Since the present library building opened in 1981, many changes have taken place in Winfield, creating the need for a new library facility. The current building does not meet handicap accessibility requirements; does not have adequate space for collections, programs, storage, or staff; and many of the building's systems are in need of updating.

In order to solve these problems and provide for improved services, the library board of trustees is proposing to build a new 28,000 square foot facility on the same site as the present library. The proposed new library facility would be fully handicap accessible, have room for collection growth for at least twenty years, provide increased public meeting space, more public access computers, quiet study areas, and increased parking, among other improvements.

The Winfield Public Library will have a referendum question on the ballot asking for an additional tax rate of .26%. This increase in tax rate will allow the library to build the new expanded 28,000 square foot facility and operate it for at least twenty years. This will be the first increase in the library's operating tax rate ever and the first increase for the building since 1979. A 1979 referendum allowed the present building to be built. The bonds issued from that referendum were paid off in 1999, dropping the tax rate back to just the operating levy amount.

The increase in rate will pay for the cost of the new building, estimated at \$7,500,000, provide additional revenue to operate the building, and provide for improved services. For an owner of a home valued at \$300,000 this will be an increase of about \$21.00 per month.
