



Adult Summer Reading Guidelines:

- Our virtual summer reading program uses the ReadSquared app and website. Register and log reading online and redeem points for virtual raffle tickets to win prizes.
- Each book you read earns 100 points. Digital badges will help you track your progress. You can change the date for each item logged as needed, and there is a limit of 600 points earned per day.
- Read whatever format you like! Books, audiobooks, and eBooks are acceptable. Sign into your account to log each title and author.
- You may also submit book reviews for an extra 25 points each.
- Redeem 300 points for a raffle ticket to enter the Raffle Prize drawing. The software keeps track of the tickets you purchase.
- You are entered into the Grand Prize drawing after earning 600 points. After logging 600 points, you may continue to log activity to earn additional Raffle Prize tickets.
- The last day to log activity is Thursday, July 31.
- Prize drawings will be held Friday, August 1. Winners will be notified by e-mail or phone. Prizes may be picked up at the library.

STEP 1: DOWNLOAD



Search for ReadSquared in the Apple or Google Play Store and click "Get" or "Install."

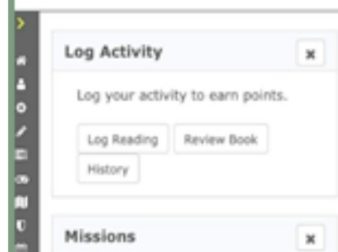


STEP 2: FIND YOUR LIBRARY

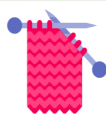

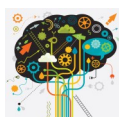

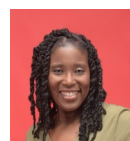
Fun and Games Trivia Night Tuesday, July 15, 7:00 p.m.
