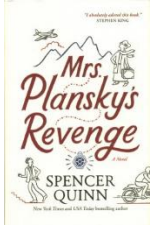

Wednesday, January 15

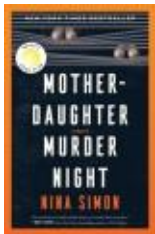

Wednesday, February 19

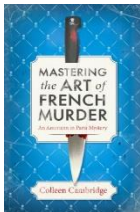

Wednesday, March 19

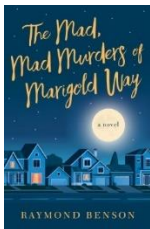

Wednesday, April 16

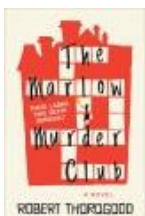
