Reading Together 2008

Winfield, Warrenville, and West Chicago Public Libraries have joined together this fall to create Reading Together, a six-week celebration of reading. The entire family is invited to participate in book discussions and special programs, this year centered around the theme of Mexican-American culture. Program and book discussion details are listed in the Reading Together brochure available at all three libraries. Book discussions for all ages

The adult discussion book will be *Bless Me, Ultima* by Rudolfo Anaya, an award-winning, semi-autobiographical novel about young Antonio Luna Marez learning to deal with issues of faith, identity, and death growing up in Guadalupe, NM in the 1940s.

The youth discussion book will be *Becoming Naomi León*, by Pam Muñoz Ryan, in which eleven-year-old Naomi is reunited with her father in Oaxaca, Mexico, and discovers both her heritage and the source of her artistic talent.

The colorful children's picture book *Piñata* by Rebecca Emberley, featuring mixed-media collage, will be featured at the Family Fiesta.

Sock Puppet Craft (RR)

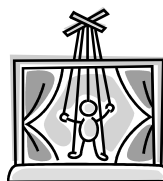
Saturday, November 1, 1:00 - 2:00 p.m.

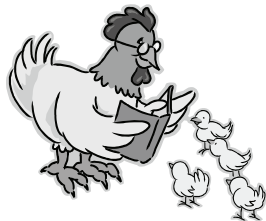


Movie Fest Friday (NR)
