In the upper right hand corner of the OneClick site, click "Create New Account." Enter your Winfield library card number (ex. P888), device type, and create your username and password. Click the "Create an Account" button and you're ready to download!

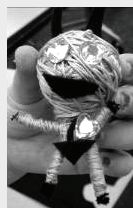
