New Library Apps

The library's eBooks, eAudiobooks, and digital magazines have never been easier to access. New apps Libby and RBdigital will give you a user-friendly and streamlined experience across your mobile devices.

If you have been downloading eBooks and eAudiobooks from eMediaLibrary using the Overdrive app, Libby is the new app for you! Libby was designed to give you faster performance and simplified download options. Please note, if you use the app's accessibility features, we recommend you stay with the current OverDrive app until Libby adds these features later this year.



Download Libby from Overdrive from your device's app store. Search for Winfield Library and sign in with your library card number and password. Borrowed titles appear on your Library Shelf and download to the app automatically so you can read them when you're offline.

We also want to give you a new, more streamlined experience when you're accessing eAudiobooks and digital magazines. Now, you don't need an app for OneClick Digital and an app for Zinio; all you need is RBdigital!

Download RBdigital from your device's app store. Once downloaded, if you currently



use OneClick Digital, your app will be updated with no further action needed. If you currently use Zinio, you will install RBdigital, and then you must delete the Zinio app from your device. Log in to the new app with your email address and password from either OneClick or Zinio and get started! If you use both OneClick and Zinio, you may log in with either password; the app will merge your two accounts.

If you have never taken advantage of your free access to the library's digital books, audiobooks, or magazines, it's the perfect time to start. There are a few things you need to know if you've never used these services:

- To use eMediaLibrary and Libby, you will first need to go to <u>www.winfield.lib.il.us</u>, click on Catalog/My Account, and set up your password. Log in with your 14-digit library card number, put in the generic password **userpass**, and you will be prompted to create your password. You will also use this password for eMediaLibrary on Libby.
- To use RBdigital, you must first set up your account through one of the RBdigital services' desktop sites. Go to <u>www.winfield.lib.il.us</u> and scroll to the bottom of the page, where you may click the RBdigital audiobook or magazine icons. Create your account on either platform, then you will be ready to download and log in to RBdigital.

Enjoy these new apps and bring the library with you wherever you go!
