NEW AND MORE ACCESSIBLE FURNITURE



You may have seen hip chairs in a medical office, as they're designed for anyone who experiences joint pain, has limited mobility, or for whom rising from a low seat can be difficult. We hope these chairs make the library more welcoming for our seniors and all those with limited mobility.

We're also excited to offer power banks for use in the library. These contain an AC outlet for laptop users, as well as two USB hubs with library-provided charging cords for Android and Apple devices. One power bank will be located in Youth Services, one in Young Adult Services, and two in Adult Services. You are welcome to use these anywhere in the library with no need to check them out.


