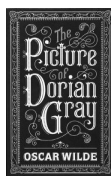

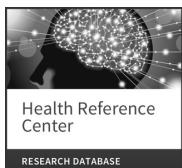

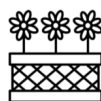
Author Meet and Greet
