NEW ONLINE SYSTEM FOR RESERVING A MEETING ROOM

The library's meeting room is now available for local groups to use as a gathering space. We are using a new online reservation system called Spaces that we hope will streamline the reservation process.

Spaces allows you to create an account, create organization listings, and make meeting room reservations. Reservations must be made at least 48 hours in advance, and will be open for the current 90 days on a rolling basis.

All reservations must be affiliated with a Winfield community group or organization. After you create your account, create or join an organization before you request a reservation. Groups must be composed mainly of citizens who reside in areas that are taxed for Winfield Library service, and must be nonprofit organizations.




