The wait is over! Our new catalog system and eBook service are live, and Nooks for checkout are now available. Thank you for your patience during implementation.

Our new catalog allows patrons to manage their accounts online, including placing reserves, creating reading lists, and renewing materials. This system uses new library cards, so please come in and update your card if you have not already done so.



EBooks and eAudiobooks are also now available to download through eMediaLibrary. There are titles for children, teens, and adults available for the Nook, Kindle, Apple devices, and more. You must have a new 14-digit library card and have your password set up in our new catalog before logging in to eMediaLibrary.

If you'd like to try eBooks but don't have an eReader, you can now check out a Nook! Nooks are preloaded with several books in one genre and are available for checkout at the library's front desk. Just search for 'Nook' in the library's catalog.

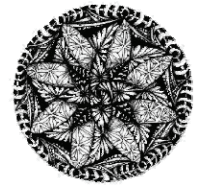
Arduino Workshop

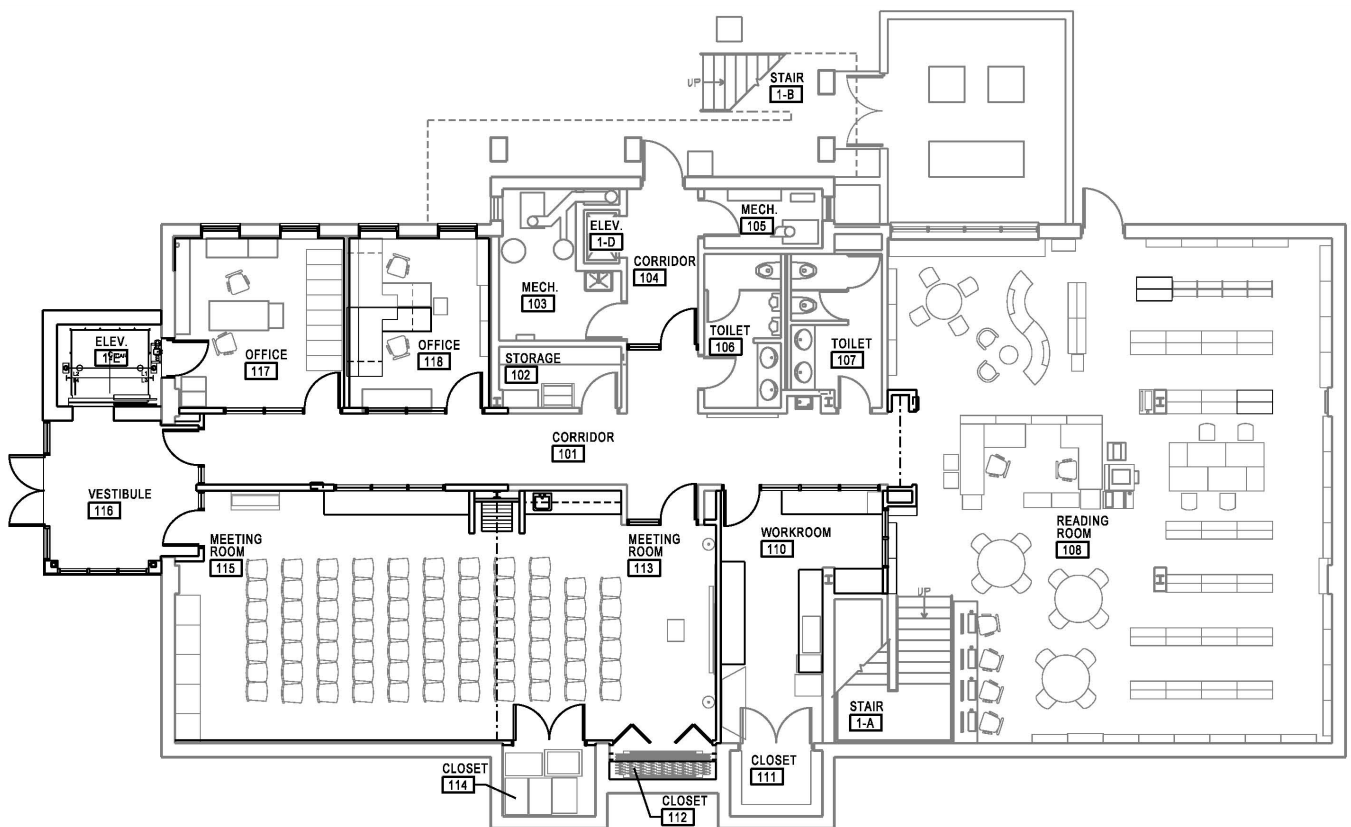
Library Building Renovation

This summer, the library will be starting a project to upgrade the library building. The project is focused on the lower level of the building and will include the following:

- New entry at the north end of the building (by the parking lot)
- New elevator
- New meeting room
- New, larger youth services area
- Refurbished washrooms on both floors
- Adult collections all on one floor

Construction is expected to start on or about July 1st and is expected to be completed by the beginning of November. The library will be open and continue to operate as normally as possible during this time. However, there may be days when the library will have to close due to construction related activities.
